Results

- Conditions
 - Large amounts of poverty, drug abuse, and incentives to stay on the reservation
 - Little freedoms, access to water, connection outside the reservation, and infrastructure.
- Leadership
- Reservations were tightly constricted by government officials
- Congress was involved in sovereignty with the Major Crimes Act of 1885.

Results

- Location
- O Most Reservations are located in the West of the United States
- O California is the state with the most reservations
- O Alaska is the state with the highest Native American Population
- Culture
- O Each tribe has their own unique traditions and styles of clothes, food, or housing
- O Practices and traditions are carried on and taught to the next generation
- O Ceremonies and rituals are preserved
- Life in America
- O Tribes have governed themselves for hundreds of years
- O Only about 22% of Native Americans live on a Reservation
- O Children who live on Reservations don't go to school
